

**Academy of Music.**—To-night, after careful preparation in the way of new scenery and machinery, will be presented, for the first time here, the grand romantic drama of the *Woman in White*, dramatised expressly for Miss Sallie St. Clair, by Charles Barras, Esq., from Wilkie Collins' famous novel of that name. It has been a great success wherever it has been performed, having enjoyed an uninterrupted run of four weeks at Pike's Opera House, Cincinnati. The cast of the piece here embodies a perfect constellation of talent, and will ensure a success fully equal to that achieved elsewhere.
